The Harbour Bath is designed to create a closer link between the city and the sea. Its space gives access to everyone, and offers multiple ways to approach the water. The project invites swimming and on water activities, as well as encouraging people to go for a walk or just sit in the sun, or simply enjoy an exciting and active public space. In other words a place that people can adapt in their own ways. The project is also a good example of partnership between designer and the support from the municipality and the Danish Foundation for Culture and Sports Facilities.

### DESCRIPTION

The Harbor Bath, in the inner city waterfront of Faaborg, is a new public water space that facilitates activities and attracts locals as well as visitors to swim and enjoy water sports, or just experience the fantastic waterfront, adding a new dimension of recreational activity to the South Funen Archipelago. It offers multiple ways to approach the water thanks to three thematic piers, which give room for everyone, toddlers, children and young people. The wooden piers form ramps, stairs, sitting opportunities and small pools for children. It also offers changing rooms and facilities for rowers, a diving platform, a water playground and a sauna for the winter bathers.
