WHY IS THIS A GOOD EXAMPLE?

Copenhagen waterfront used to be very business oriented, but that changed with Kalvebod Bolge. It is an urban space that brings the city closer to the water through waving and bending surfaces. The promenade rises to different levels and stretches out into the harbour providing space for a range of recreational water activities. The Kalvebod Wave is a good example on how to attract local citizens back to the waterfront and liven the local neighborhood by connecting it to existing infrastructure. It is designed with keeping in mind various target groups and to provide spaces for all ages and interests. People adopt the Waves in their own ways, beyond what anyone could have imagined in advance.

DESCRIPTION

Kalvebod Brygge Wave provides a connection between the water and the office buildings looming over the river. It represents a series of platforms above the river that take into account the wind and sun conditions to attract locals to the waterfront. The new recreational area blends together with cities existing infrastructure and connection networks. The pier allows for a flexible public space to host events and is perfect for the kayakers who use the harbour, who now have a kayak slide and a 'kayak hotel' storage facility. The new waterfront is welcoming to walkers, joggers, cyclists, skaters, swimmers and kayakers and also tourists who enjoy the exceptional view out over the harbour.
